Excess

The school board declared 3 teachers excess in one vocational training specialty. The teachers concerned were invited to attend an information Zoom meeting with myself and Ms. Lavoie, Assistant Director of Human Resources, on April 26, 2023. This information session was meant to answer teacher questions regarding the excess process and their future placement.

Mentoring

A survey was sent out by the school board to mentors in order to get their feedback. Some suggestions to improve next year's program were: Providing more opportunities for mentors/mentees to meet, have dedicated days for group meetings of mentors/mentees, mentors requested to receive support from ESD consultants, etc. New teachers involved in the mentoring program will also be receiving a survey for feedback purposes.

Support for Assistive Care in Long-Term Care Centres Skills Training Certificate

WICC and PACC will both be starting one cohort each if there are enough registrations. The *Support for Assistive Care in Long-Term Care Centres* consists of a 375-hour program over a 12-week period from August to September 2023. The students will be entitled to a \$12,000 bursary.

Hybrid/Online Teaching

As a standing item at our LRC meetings, it was confirmed that each centre has been given the flexibility to offer courses according to their needs and what the community seems interested in. Participation in these hybrid/online models remains voluntary for teachers at this time.
