STAFFING TIMELINE

You will find the official staffing timeline on SSO, under the Human Resources tab. If you click on "Staffing", you will see "Teachers Youth Sector" and you will then see the "Official Staffing Timeline 2024-2025". Important dates for teachers coming up soon:

By April 29: Leave of absence/progressive retirement/sabbatical decisions; teachers

are notified in writing

By April 29: Excess teachers notified in writing

April 29: Excess teachers' information meeting (online)

April 30-May 3: Vacancy list posted on SSO

April 30-May 3: Excess teachers request transfers

By May 10: Excess teachers notified of placement

May 14: Updated vacancy list posted on SSO

May 14-May 17: Request for voluntary transfers (round 1)

By May 24: Teachers informed of voluntary transfer decisions (round 1)

RREGOP ISSUES FOR MENTORS

HR continues to work to verify and correct each mentor teacher's RREGOP issues manually, starting with those closest to retirement. 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MENTORING

The final appointment is still made by the school board. Mentors will be notified by May 31 as to their position for next year.
