Mozaik Updates

Some concerns were brought up with IT. Teachers could still share concerns they have with PTU. Jason Cantelmi from the IT department will follow up with GRICS to get some answers.

LBPSB Network Accessibility

Teachers are encouraged to use their usernames and passwords when logging in to computers, desktops and laptops.

Implementation of CCQ 2024-2025

Exemption from CCQ - no exemption from course; students can be exempted from a theme. It is the same process as to be exempted from sexual education; they might be requested to provide proof from a medical professional or from their religious organization. The principal then decides if the criteria have been met; they ensure the validity of the information provided to request an exemption. It should be very difficult to meet the criteria.

Students over 14 years of age cannot make the request by themselves; educational autonomy is not the same as medical autonomy; the exemption request must come from the parents.

Continuing Education

Both PACC Adult and Place Cartier have implemented *info-sanction* 23-24-29 *Mesures d'adaptation autorisées lors des épreuves ministérielles*. Should teachers have questions regarding *info-sanction* 23-24-29, they should be reaching out to the Centre Director who will then follow up with Lina Laflèche (*responsable de Sanction des études*) and Maggie Soldano for clarifications.

OurSCHOOL Survey has been modified with the removal of the questions related to Quality Instruction (Effective Learning Time, Relevance, Rigour) and Classroom Context (Positive Teacher-Student Relations; Expectations for Academic Success). With the changes in place, centres will be able to administer the survey in February as planned.

The committee reviewed, in small groups, the current Student Evaluation Policy in order to offer feedback for the drafting of the new policy.
