EVALUATION AND PEDAGOGY

MEQ Exam Schedule

The exam schedule has been delayed to allow coordination with other school boards, to ensure that no exam is given earlier than the agreed upon date.

Déboulage in High Schools

The school board has applied for additional funding from the government to offer support to students. Specific plans for how to use this money will be determined once the amounts are confirmed.

Some planning for next year has begun, but a lot depends on the results of this year.

Cross Curricular Competencies

The school board clarified that the template provided of which competency to do at each grade level was just a starting point and schools should feel free to modify it as they see fit. The school's TOS will program according to the decisions of the school.

TEACHER TRAINING

Teacher Workshops

The schedule for January 30th workshops was sent to all teachers so that they could see everything being offered. As January 30th is also the special needs planning day, principals may release teachers from workshops if they are needed for the full day.

The use of hybrid PD sessions suggested at the last EPC meeting has been considered by the board, and while it is unlikely to be used this year, they feel there may be a place for this type of session in the future.

SOFTWARE AND ONLINE SERVICES

Mozaik and GPI

Jason Cantelmi, Assistant Director of IT, explained that there is a module in Mozaik that schools can turn on to provide more detailed information about student absences. This can be done at the school level.

A request was made to investigate the double sign-in required on Mozaik. Jason will investigate and get back to us with more information.

Google Storage Limits

The Microsoft Teams pilot program at Lakeside Academy is successfully underway, and the teacher in charge has provided some feedback. The feedback is centered around ways of allowing students to have access to accounts as well, when needed for projects like the yearbook, school news, etc.

Student accounts have officially been restricted if they exceeded the 20 GB limit. Warnings were sent to both students and parents. Schools have been notified about which students have accounts that are restricted. Overall, there are about 80 students affected by this.

CLIC École

The launch date for *CLIC École* will be February 3rd. The communication module will now be turned off for all schools upon deployment. A communication about the use of *CLIC École* will be sent out. Teachers do not have to do anything about this. *CLIC École* is simply another way for parents to interact with the Mozaik system and should have no direct impact on teachers.

Google Studio AI

A request for information was made about this software. The school board will investigate but explained that school accounts are subject to different laws and regulations than private accounts, and so it may not be possible.
