## **EVALUATION AND PEDAGOGY**

### ***Déboulage* in High Schools**

The school board will be meeting with principals to help establish best practices for dealing with *déboulage*. Efforts will be focused on at risk grade 9 students. A letter will be sent from the school board to all at risk grade 9 students to emphasize the seriousness of the situation.

\$10 000 will be allocated to each high school to pay for additional grade 9 tutoring. How to spend the money will be determined by the schools, but the hours of tutoring provided need to be logged.

A math tutorial for grade 9 students has been developed and is available on the Math Help Services platform. The board has also hired teachers to produce similar materials for science courses, which will also be housed on the Math Help Services platform. Similar history materials will be produced, but are awaiting funding, and the material will likely not be available this year.

### **Summer School**

The school board is in the process of examining the effectiveness of summer school for student progression.

Summer school will be offered for grade 9, 10, and 11 students this year, with online courses and exams in person at a central location. The location should be more centralized this year to make travel easier for more students.

Summer school for grade 7 and 8 students will be available through the Learn Quebec platform, and be available for Math, English, and French courses.

## **TEACHER TRAINING**

### **Teacher Workshops**

Teachers who missed the government mandated video workshops on March 23, will need to complete it on another day. The training should be offered again on May 15, and again in August. It is uncertain what the format will be at the moment. Teachers in the ContEd sector may have different days offered that match with their calendar.

## **SOFTWARE AND ONLINE SERVICES**

### **Google Classroom**

Jason Cantelmi, Assistant Director of IS, confirmed that Gemini should be available for all teachers to use with Google Classroom. He will investigate why some teachers don't seem to have access.

With regards to the number of clicks required to log into Mozaik, we were informed that the system is working as designed, and no change can be made at the school-board level.

A request was made to investigate having an additional save button appear at the top of the page when entering report card marks on Mozaik.
